Consistently implementing a full schedule of high-quality and varied programming requires a dedicated and talented staff. I would like to recognize the Nixon Foundation staff for being resilient, remaining

Jim Byron Elected President and CEO of the Nixon Foundation

28-year-old succeeds Hugh Hewitt, who remains on the Board

im Byron, a 28-year-old nonprofit executive whose career with the Nixon Foundation began in 2007 as a 14-year-old marketing intern, was unanimously elected last November as President, CEO, and a member of the Board of Directors of the Richard Nixon Foundation.

Hugh Hewitt, who served as President and CEO beginning in July 2019, will remain an active member of the Board of Directors and continue to have a key role in much of the Foundation's advancement and long-range initiatives.

"There is no one better than Jim to succeed me," Hugh Hewitt said. "It is clear to everyone that Jim is the best person possible for this job, representing the next generation of civic leaders and tasked with leading President Nixon's Foundation for many years into the future. Jim has my full support, and I'm standing by if he needs assistance or advice from an aging radio host."

"I am honored to be invited to serve the legacy of President and Mrs. Nixon in this new role," Byron said. "The full effect of President Nixon's life is becoming more apparent with time. It's now clear that all Americans are legatees of President Nixon; his was a life of immense consequence that shaped the world I grew up in, and I'm excited to lead the effort to teach and inspire new generations with this information — though I have very, very big shoes to fill."

Chairman James Cavanaugh said, "President Nixon hired and inspired young people to serve in his administration and to advance his agenda, many of whom went on to enjoy very successful careers. Jim Byron represents the next generation of that type of individual: energetic, creative, decisive, and forward-thinking with management skills far beyond his years."

Byron is a native of Santa Monica, California and grew up in Orange County. He is a graduate of Chapman University, where he earned his Bachelor's Degree in Business Administration with a Minor in History. Byron is the author of *A President Comes Home*, the official Nixon Library commemorative book and a history of the Nixon Presidential Library (2018). He lives in Costa Mesa and enjoys playing tennis and golf. *

Ensuring millions of people in the most vulnerable communities had access to Covid testing and vaccinations, the organization's latest efforts include setting up operations in Poland to support Ukrainian refugees.

Nixon Seminar Co-chair and former National Security

Adviser Ambassador Robert C. O'Brien will join Penn to discuss the many ongoing geopolitical implications of the war. Prior to his service as National Security Adviser in the Trump

Administration, O'Brien served as the Special Presidential Envoy for Hostage Affairs and, before that, a U.S.

Representative to the UN General Assembly.

Fox News Chief Political Anchor Bret Baier will interview Penn and O'Brien together in the East Room of the Nixon Library. Baier anchors *Special Report with Bret Baier*, the top-rated cable news program in its time slot.



ecember 2021 marked the 50th anniversary of President Nixon signing the National Cancer Act of 1971.

To celebrate that visionary and transformative bipartisan legislation, the Richard Nixon Foundation hosted the first Nixon National Cancer Conference on December 1st and 2nd. This two-day gathering consisted of distinguished Nobel laureates, cancer center directors, clinicians, researchers, and public health officials to assess the past, analyze the present, and envision the future of cancer treatment and research.

The first panel consisted of Nobel laureate James P. Allison, Ph.D., Nobel laureate David Baltimore, Ph.D., Nobel laureate Phillip Sharp, Ph.D., and was moderated by Andrew von Eschenbach, M.D. This panel stepped back to the past and assessed the National Cancer Act—Discovering Cancer's Secrets. Each

panelist reflected on how the National Cancer Act of 1971 directly impacted their professional careers.

The second panel featured **Stephan A. Grupp**, **M.D.**, **Ph.D.**, **Lori J. Pierce**, **Ph.D.**, **Peter Pisters**, **M.D.**, **and was moderated** by **Steven T. Rosen**, **M.D.** The panel discussed The National

Cancer Act—Saving Lives, from Hopelessness to Hope and focused on current cancer research.

Between the second and third panel, a luncheon reception was presented by UCI Health. Following the luncheon, the **Director** of the National Cancer Institute, Ned Sharpless, M.D., spoke virtually to conference attendees on the work of the National

Cancer Institute.

The third and final panel looked ahead to the future of cancer research and discussed The National Cancer Act—Changing the Future of Cancer. The panel consisted of Mauro Ferrari, Ph.D., William W. Li, M.D., Larry Norton, M.D., Stephen Hahn, M.D., and was moderated by Anna Barker, Ph.D.

50TH ANNIVERSARY—

of President Nixon's Trip to China

On February 24th more than 300 leaders of the Southern California Chinese-American community gathered to recreate the dinner hosted in honor of President and Mrs. Nixon by Chinese Premier Zhou Enlai 50 years ago in the Great Hall of the People.

A video message from **Dr. Henry Kissinger**—President Nixon's key partner in the development and implementation of the trip to China—began the evening's program. **The gala raised over \$800,000 to support the educational mission of the Foundation.**

In-person remarks were delivered by current and former American and Chinese government officials and diplomats including **The Honorable Elaine Chao**, 24th U.S. Secretary of Labor and 18th U.S. Secretary of Transportation and the first Chinese American to be appointed to a President's cabinet in American history, former U.S. Ambassador to the PRC Stapleton Roy, and PRC Ambassador to the United States Qin Gang in his first visit to the U.S. West Coast.

The event was full of historic tributes in every detail. The seven-course menu catered by **Shanghailander Palace** was bursting with symbolism. The evening's festivities included an hour-long performance of music, dance and theater to highlight the fusion of the American and Chinese cultures today. Additionally, ping-pong players treated guests to demonstrations as a tribute to the Ping-Pong Diplomacy that helped pave the way for the Nixons' historic visit.

The 50th anniversary celebration kicked off a year's worth of programming to commemorate "The Week That Changed The World," culminating in a National Policy Conference in Washington, D.C., November 2022. The programming has very generously been underwritten by Ming and Eva Hsieh and Charlie and Ling Zhang.

ARCHITECTS OF PEACE

Secretary Pompeo and Ambassador O'Brien Given Architect of Peace Award



n October 14, 2021, 250 friends, benefactors and admirers gathered in the Nixon Library's East Room to pay tribute to **two men whose names now join an elite** pantheon of notable Architects of Peace: former Secretary of State Mike Pompeo and former National Security Adviser Robert C. O'Brien.

The awards were given for their work developing and **implementing** both the 2020 Abraham Accords and the 2020 Serbia-Kosovo economic normalization agreements, as well as their oversight of the repatriation of more than 50 American hostages detained abroad.

In accepting their awards, both the Secretary and the Ambassador stressed pragmatism over ideology, as well as the need to work with American allies and adversaries from a position of strength and take concrete steps to deter aggression.

The Architect of Peace Award was established in 1995 shortly after President Nixon's death and is given to individuals who embody his lifelong goal of shaping a more peaceful world.

Among the 250 guests were such notables as Governor and Mrs. Pete Wilson—the Governor is a longtime member of the Nixon Foundation Board—four members of Congress, Academy Award winning actor Jon Voight, and Hollywood icons Mary Hart and Burt Sugarman. Pastor Greg Laurie of Harvest Christian Fellowship delivered the evening's invocation. The Architect of Peace Gala raised nearly \$450,000 to support the ongoing works of the Foundation.

Official 2022 White House Christmas Ornament Unveiled at the Nixon Library

residents Day is always one of the most popular days at the Nixon Library but this year history was made with the first West Coast unveiling of the Official 2022 White House Christmas Ornament. The ornament celebrates the White House traditions of the 37th President Richard Nixon and First Lady Pat Nixon. The iconic gingerbread design pays homage to the fact that the official White House gingerbread house became an annual Christmas tradition during the Nixon administration when, in 1969, Mrs. Nixon asked Assistant Executive Chef Hans Raffert to create a

gingerbread house to display prominently in the State Dining Room.

Other treasured Christmas traditions established by Mrs. Nixon included introducing poinsettia trees to the holiday décor, resurrecting the tradition of hanging wreaths in each of the windows facing Pennsylvania Avenue and initiating Christmas candlelight tours.

Stewart McLaurin, President of the White House Historical Association and Jim Byron, President of the Richard Nixon Foundation joined five presidents and Nixon Foundation Board Member Christopher Nixon Cox in a countdown to reveal the design of this year's ornament.

In honor of Presidents Day, museum visitors also received cherry pie from

Polly's Pies and were able to interact with President Washington, President Lincoln, President Teddy Roosevelt, President Franklin D. Roosevelt and President Andrew Jackson.

The festivities kicked off a year-long partnership with the White House Historical Association that will illuminate the Nixons' White House legacy through educational programming. *\pm\$

WHEN "PANDA-MONIUM" CREATED A NATIONAL ICON





Just two months after viewing the pandas at the Peking Zoo, First Lady Pat Nixon welcomed a pair of giant pandas to the National Zoo in Washington, DC as an act of goodwill diplomacy from the Chinese.

THIS APRIL MARKS THE 50TH ANNIVERSARY of the arrival of a pair of Giant Pandas to the National Zoo in Washington, D.C. This followed President and Mrs. Nixon's historic trip to the People's Republic of China in February 1972, which set the stage for

People's Republic of China in February 1972, which set the st normalization of relations between the two nations.

This first example of panda diplomacy was a direct result of First Lady Pat Nixon's encounter with Giant Pandas at the Peking Zoo. At a state banquet later in the trip she noticed a picture of pandas on a container of cigarettes and remarked to Chinese Premier Zhou En-Lai, "Aren't they cute? I love them." He responded, "I'll give you some."

Just two months later a pair of Giant Pandas, Ling-Ling and Hsing-Hsing, arrived to their new home with much fanfare. News articles remarked on the substantial security provided for the furry ambassadors. Over 20,000 people joined the First Lady to welcome the pandas to the zoo.

"Here at the National Zoo they will be enjoyed by the millions of people who come from across the country to visit the nation's capital each year," Mrs. Nixon said in a ceremony on April 16, 1972.

Wearing a panda pin on her lapel, she declared that "Pandamonium" had broken out at the Zoo.

The First Lady was right. An estimated 1.1 million people came to visit the pandas in their first year at the zoo, and they have remained the Zoo's top attraction for nearly 50 years.

The historic arrival of the first pandas in the United States paved the way for the National Zoo to become a leader in panda education and conservation while the panda habitat remains one of the most popular attractions in the Nation's capital. *





SENATOR BOB DOLE

Bob Dole served in Congress for 35 years and was the former Senate majority leader. He was the Republican nominee for Vice President (1976) and President (1996).
